

DENTAL INJURIES

Dental Expenses:

When students sustain dental injuries at school refer parents to their employee benefits and/or student accident insurer. When no other coverage is available other avenues to consider are as follows:

CINOT:

The Ministry of Health offers a dental program for children whose teeth are in need of care. The Children in Need of Treatment (CINOT) program is managed by public health units. The dentists who supply the treatment are paid by the Ontario Government.

All eligible children found to have dental pain, infections, bleeding or injury will be treated right away. Any condition that will soon lead to pain or infection is also covered by the program

Advise parents to visit the Ministry of Health web site and/or contact the local Health unit to see if the student is eligible for this program.

Services for First Nations People

You may be eligible for medical services: Health Canada's [Non-insured Health Benefits Program](#) provides medical goods and services to supplement benefits provided through private, provincial, territorial or federal health insurance plans. If you're a registered Indian, a recognized Inuit or Innu, you may be eligible for the following benefits:

- drugs
- dental care
- eye care
- medical supplies and equipment
- medical transportation
- crisis intervention counseling

Toronto Free Dental Clinics

The dental program provides free basic dental services such as examining teeth and gums, x-rays, fillings, preventive services (including cleaning, scaling, topical fluoride, sealants), extractions, root canal treatment (on selected teeth), dentures and partial dentures. While there is no charge for dental treatment, clients are asked to pay half of the dental laboratory cost for dentures and denture repairs.
